#### Important Graduation Information



Culver City High School's 2016 graduation ceremony will take place on **Friday, June 10<sup>th</sup> at 5:00 pm** at the Jerry Chabola Stadium, Culver City High School.

The ceremony has been moved up an hour from previous years to assist parents in celebrating their graduate's accomplishments after the ceremony.

- The Activities Office is busy planning activities. ASB will host a UCLA blood drive on Friday, January 22<sup>nd</sup>. We are proud of our many students who volunteer to donate blood and save lives.
- The third annual Leadership Conference will take place on Tuesday, January 26<sup>th</sup>. Organized by our ASB, this year's theme will focus on the importance of good character for leadership. Ninety of our students, including club presidents, students nominated by their teachers, student athletes and student scholars, will participate in sessions focused on character, leadership and change. Michael Josephson, of the Josephson Institute of Ethics, will be the keynote speakers. Conference participants will have the unique opportunity of having a lunch discussion with key business leaders in Culver City about the necessary skills one needs to possess as a good leader.
- ASB will then focus on planning its annual nonprofit fair to introduce students to the wonderful opportunities that exist is our community where they can potentially complete some service learning hours.
- Centaurs pride themselves on how accepting we are of one another despite the multiple races and cultures we have at our school. ASB will present an Intercultural Assembly to our students on February 24<sup>th</sup> to continue the practice of sharing the Centaur intercultural culture.
- CCHS has a House of Representatives which has a student representative from each 2<sup>nd</sup> period. The House of Reps meets each month to discuss student and school concerns. This group of dedicated students has had their voices heard and influenced changes at the high school including changes in our school bathrooms and influencing school policies.
- Dr. Valverde, our Activities Director, continues to guide our ASB students in creating powerful events at our school and exposing the entire student body to new ways of thinking. We are thankful for his dedication as well as the dedication of our incredible ASB members.

#### CCHS Scheduling Fair

On February 26, we will be holding a SCHEDULING FAIR during an extended lunch. This fair will be the Friday after counselor presentation (in Social Studies classes) about the scheduling process for the 2016-2017 school year. It is most important that all of our students make informed choices about the courses they take: whether AP/Honors, CTE, or elective courses. At the fair students can talk to teachers and former students of the classes to find out details about the course and ask any questions. Please discuss course selections with your students and encourage them to attend the scheduling fair. #### 220 Credits .....requirement to walk in Graduation Ceremony

Last year Board policy was revised so that seniors must complete all 220 required credits in order to walk in the graduation ceremony. Counselors will continue to work with students to utilize all our district resources so that seniors may participate in the culminating ceremony. Resources include: summer school, Adult School, iAcademy, Culver Park, 7th period independent study, among others. Please ask your child's counselor for more information regarding remediation of credits.



#### **Centaur Plus**

Centaur Plus is a 24-minute academic tutorial opportunity for all students in the subject of their greatest need. This is a chance for teachers to give skill-based interventions as well as homework completion assistance based on the need of the student. Centaur Plus is built into the Monday/Thursday bell schedule without increasing minutes in the school day. Students have the capability to schedule their Centaur Plus session through their Enriching Students online account. Centaur Plus will resume February 8<sup>th</sup> for 2<sup>nd</sup> semester. 

#### **Pursuing Victory With Honor**

We believe every student-athlete at Culver City High School should demonstrate a high level of ethics and sportsmanship during athletic competitions. As a program specifically created for athletes to give coaches, teachers, and administrators the tools to help foster good character in young athletes, it was adopted by the California Interscholastic Federation (CIF) in 1999 in recognition of the impact that sports can have on developing good character in student-athletes.

Student-athletes are expected to uphold the Six Pillars of Characters: Trustworthiness, Respect, Responsibility, Fairness, Caring, and Citizenship. These principles were developed by the Josephson Institute of Ethics and part of the Character COUNTS initiative that provide common language and expectations that shape school culture. It is our goal to have every student-athlete embody these core values as he or she *Pursue Victory With Honor*.
