For all NEW AVPA Art Students: Portfolio reviews and interviews: Sept 13-17, 3:15pm, Room 1.

For all RETURNING AVPA Art Students: Portfolio reviews and interviews: Sept 1-9, 3:15-6:15pm, Room 1. You must bring a portfolio of all completed artwork from CCHS ONLY including a sketchbook. You will be assigned a date/time and notified via email in late August. Because of the large number of returning students, special requests cannot be accommodated. All interviews are mandatory if you are interested in AVPA for the 2010-11 school year.

Returning and New students in *Instrumental Music*: prepare a short excerpt of music that best demonstrates your technical and musical abilities (from a solo, etude, ensemble piece, etc.). You will be asked to perform major and minor scales (please prepare scales in keys of: Bb, Eb, and F major, and A, G and C minor – not concert pitch, but in the written pitch for your instrument). Interview will take place along with the music audition. Auditions will take place beginning at 3:00 pm on Wednesday, Sept 15, and beginning at 3:15 pm on Thursday, Sept 16.

Returning and New students in *Vocal Music*:

- 1. Vocal Auditions: Monday, Sept 14, 3:15 pm, room 94. All vocalists wishing to audition for AVPA Music Department must attend this audition. Please note: this is for all AVPA students who wish to become a member of the music company (major or minor) and for featured vocalists positions with all ensembles, including Jazz, and productions (but not the spring musical). Please prepare a short excerpt (32 bars preferred) of a standard musical theatre or classical work. Accompanist may not be provided you may bring one if you'd like (live or recorded).
- 2. Chamber Singers auditions are Tuesday, Sept 15, 3:15 pm, in room 94. Do not prepare any music. Warm ups and an excerpt will be taught to those auditioning. This audition is for all singers interested in joining Chamber Singers, separate from the Monday vocal audition. The audition piece will be taught by Dr. Spano to all those interested in advance preparation on Thursday, Sept 9, 3:15pm in Room 94. We have been accepted to participate in the LA Master Chorale's High School Choir Festival at Disney Hall on April 15, 2011. This audition is for a full-year's commitment.

Interviews for vocal majors will be scheduled separately from the audition on Monday, Sept 14.

NOTE: ALL MUSIC students will be required to complete a **written music theory evaluation**. This will take place on **Wednesday**, **Sept 8**, **3:00 pm in Room 94**.

Please visit Dr. Spano in Room 94 beginning the first day of school to schedule an audition and/or interview. A list of available times will be posted there. Early auditions on Sept 1 and 2 may be available.

Returning Applicants for Theatre: Full Application including 2010-11 Parent Information Sheet. Essay: "How I Have Changed From My Experiences in AVPA." 2 minute 1st person monologue from a memoir – may be adapted from a novel – must be fully memorized. Audition dates: **Technical Theatre Majors**, Friday, Sept 3, 3:15-6:30pm (bring a portfolio of your technical production work) and **Acting Majors**, Saturday, Sept 4, 9am-5pm. <u>Email Ms. Silver</u> to set up your audition time (sheilasilver@ccusd.org). Your AVPA audition will serve as your audition for the Fall Production (The Laramie Project by Moises Kaufman). Call backs for the fall production: Saturday, Sept 25, 1-5pm (as needed).

What is AVPA?

The Culver City High School **Academy of Visual & Performing Arts** is an arts education program that includes arts elective classes during the day at CCHS in Film, Theatre, Music and Art. AVPA offers an extended day program, with Dance joining the other arts disciplines, where students enroll in classes (many for college credit) and workshops, participate in field trips, exhibitions, productions, concerts, and much more. Students work with professional artists and have opportunities to collaborate with arts and educational institutions. Students receive a transcript of their work, along with a certificate of completion when they graduate. A minimum donation of \$100 per semester for Film, Theatre, Dance, and Music, and a \$60/year materials fee for Art, is requested from each family with a student in our program. The AVPA Foundation, a parent-run non-profit, also plans many fundraisers throughout the year to help support our programs.
